FACILITY BACKGROUND

Oakwood Custom Coating was located in the City of Taylor on the southeast corner of the Delta Avenue and Brest Road intersection in a mainly industrial setting. The nearest residential area is adjacent

to the facility on its east corner. The facility was considered a minor source, although this facility had previously been registered as a 208a source. The purpose of the inspection was to determine the facility's compliance with state and federal air pollution regulations, as well as the permit conditions agreed upon.

COMPLAINT/COMPLIANCE HISTORY

No complaints have been received since the last inspection in March 2006.

PROCESS EQUIPMENT AND CONTROLS

Oakwood Custom Coating was a parts coater, coating automotive speaker grill covers and interior trim panels for automobile parts manufacturing companies and also for auto parts suppliers. The company cleaned the parts and then coated each part with one of the two types of coating. Plastic parts were sprayed on the liquid line and metal parts were powder coated. Each line had a dry off and a bake oven. There was also a burn off oven used to clean the parts. A sand blast unit had been removed from the facility. Oakwood CustomCoating operated one liquid paint line, and one powder coating line, with a natural gas-fired curing oven.

INSPECTION NARRATIVE

Ms. Jill Zimmerman arrived at the site at 10:00 am to conduct a targeted inspection.

When I arrived at the facility, no vehicles were parked in the parking lot, and the lights were off. All of the furniture from the lobby had been removed, as it was empty. The front door was locked, and there was a sign on the door which said to contact Motor City Solutions.

This facility is now considered closed.

APPLICABLE RULES/PERMIT CONDITIONS

Currently the facility has Wayne County permits numbered c-10448 & c-10449 for the installation of small plastic parts coating line with a spray booth and a curing oven, and Wayne County permits numbered c-9710 through c-9715 for the installation of two powder coating lines - four powder spray booths with cartridge filter dust collector and a batch burn off oven with integral afterburner, and a blast – n – peen equipment with a baghouse dust collector, although the blast – n – peen equipment has been removed from the facility.

Because the equipment has been removed from this location, and no operations are currently occurring at this location, these permits have been voided.

MAERS REPORT REVIEW

The facility is no longer required to submit MAERS. MAERS was last submitted for reporting year 2008, and appeared to be accurately submitted.

FINAL COMPLIANCE DETERMINATION

Oakwood Custom Coating is no longer operating at this location. All permits have been voided.
