On March 24, 2017, I attempted to conduct an inspection at Borin/Boice Inc. with an address of 892 Orchard Lake Road, Pontiac. When I arrived at the site, I noticed a relatively newer building with an address of 888 Orchard Lake Road. The building next to it on the left has an address of 900 Orchard Lake Road and is occupied by Mr. Bid, a flooring and cabinetry supplier and installer. I spoke with Rob Mcbee from Mr. Bid, and he verified that the building next door is 888 Orchard Lake Road and he does not know where 892 Orchard Lake Road is or if it still exists. Rob mentioned that the building next door is a warehouse and not aware that the occupants are operating portable cement silos.

The fence around the building located at 888 Orchard Lake Road is closed. I could not see cement silos or any associated baghouse control device.

I called the phone number listed on the permit application (586 772-7000). I spoke with Dave and he verified that Borin/Boise no longer exists. It was bought out by Best Block more than 20 years ago. Dave also verified that the property on 892 Orchard Lake Road was bought by Home Depot. He also verified that the portable cement silos at that location are gone.

Borin/Boice was issued Permit-to-Install No. 536-91 for Megamix portable cement silos equipped with a baghouse dust collector. This permit will be voided.

This facility will be marked permanently shut down in MACES.
