**VIOLATION NOTICE**

On October 28, 2016, the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Air Quality Division (AQD), conducted an inspection of Camshaft Machine Company (Company) located at 717 Woodworth Road, Jackson, Michigan. The purpose of this inspection was to determine the Company's compliance with the requirements of the federal Clean Air Act; Part 55, Air Pollution Control, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended (Act 451); the Air Pollution Control Rules.

During the inspection, AQD staff observed the following:

| Manganese phosphate etching line | Rule 201                       | No permit to install. Emissions are exhausted outside via a dedicated exhaust. It was determined that the process does not qualify for a Rule 290 exemption. |

During this inspection, it was noted that the Company had installed and commenced operation of an unpermitted process at this facility. AQD staff advised the Company on 10/31/2016, that this could be a violation of Act 451, Rule 201.

A program for compliance may include a completed PTI application for the manganese phosphate etching line. An application form is available by request, or at the following website:

Be advised that Rule 201 requires that a permit be obtained prior to installation, construction, operation, reconstruction, relocation, or alteration of any process or process equipment which may be a source of an air contaminant.

Please initiate actions necessary to correct the cited violation and submit a written response to this Violation Notice by November 28, 2016. The written response should include: the dates the violation occurred; an explanation of the causes and duration of the violation; whether the violation is ongoing; a summary of the actions that have been taken and are proposed to be taken to correct the violation and the dates by which these actions will take place; and what steps are being taken to prevent a reoccurrence.

If the Company believes the above observations or statements are inaccurate or do not constitute violations of the applicable legal requirements cited, please provide appropriate factual information to explain your position.

Thank you for your attention to resolving the violation cited above and for the cooperation that was extended to me during my inspection of this Company.
