Please see the written response below in regards to the Violation Notice received Pitsch Sanitary Landfill. The Notice is dated August 26th and pertains to your visit to PSL on August 4th.

Pitsch Sanitary Landfill had received manifested asbestos-containing waste on August 1st. This waste had been disposed of in a separate dedicated asbestos area within our active cell area. The asbestos area is designated with its own service/access drive, and the dump hole is indicated and highlighted by two 55-gallon blue barrels. The blue barrels are also taped with red asbestos caution tape and have the approved asbestos Warning signs attached to each barrel and facing opposite of the dump hole entrance; the asbestos hole is roughly 50 feet deep. Asbestos-containing waste must be covered with compacted non-asbestos-containing cover material at the end of each operating day it is received.

The cause of the lack of non-asbestos-containing cover material being used from August 1st through August 4th was because of my lack of reinforcement of this very inspection, which has since been added to my sign out checklist of mandatory items. This Violation is not ongoing, as it is checked every evening by myself, or by my Site Supervisor (Mr. Monroe) in my absence. Since I joined the PSL as Landfill Manager in April of this year, I have been endeavoring in safe and proper disposal, and we made great efforts to improve the previous asbestos disposal area with greater safety and visibility. The safety of daily non-asbestos-containing cover material will not be overlooked, and will be observed on a daily basis to ensure cover material is put on top before end of day.

I have made the entire PSL working crew aware of this Violation, and I have coached the equipment operators on proper cover material and that it is needed to cover every day we receive an asbestos-containing waste load. The daily observance of cover, along with the coaching and awareness session with the PSL working crew, were both done on the same day of your visit, August 4th.
