Dear Mr. Forth:

This letter is being submitted to meet the response requirement included in the June 11, 2019 Violation Notice. This response is tailored to respond to the Violation as required in the Notice.

Date of Alleged Violation:

May 3, 2019

Explanation of Causes and Duration of the Violation:

Continental Aluminum (Continental) has reviewed the facility parametric date for the date and time in question. During this period all parametric data for the equipment shows compliance with the required thresholds. Some of this data from our CMS system is provided in Attachment A of this document. In interviews with our operations staff we have not noted any variances from normal operation. Additionally, the facility baghouses were replaced last year and therefore the facility has new baghouses in operation that would not show any age degradation at this point. Based on our thorough review of the processes during the time in question, Continental cannot locate a root cause or a parametric variable that shows that the facility was operating out of normal compliance operations during this period. Data collected demonstrates that Continental was operating in compliance with permit requirements during this period of time and is unsure of the relation of the odor to the facility operations.

Whether the Violation is On-Going:

The violation is not on-going and Continental is not sure that the violation came from the Milford Road facility.

Summary of Actions to be taken or have been taken to prevent reoccurrence:

Continental has reviewed the facility processes and data collection to ensure that the facility is operating properly and within the limits of the facility permit. Continental believes that these requirements are presently being met.

Additional Request to provide information on ground level white cloud:

Continental has also reviewed facility operational data and conducted interviews regarding the alleged observance of a ground level white cloud. Although Continental has no solid evidence for an explanation, a potential explanation provided was the operation of a semi truck during that period which has the potential to discharge white clouds of smoke during start-up and increased effort to move or pull equipment. There are no ground level process sources.

Based on the review of parametric data the facility is required to collect to meet the facility air permit and interviews with facility staff Continental is unsure that the alleged odors emanated from the facility. Continental continually strives to be a good community partner and works to maintain compliance with all applicable requirements. As shown with the installation of new baghouses within the last year, Continental values environmental compliance and is always agreeable to working with the state to maintain compliance status.
