**VIOLATION NOTICE**

On January 5, 2017, the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Air Quality Division (AQD), sent the enclosed letter to Middletons Mouldings (Facility), located at 575 Race Street, Coldwater, Michigan. The purpose of this letter was to request a demonstration of the Facility's potential-to-emit (PTE) based on a June 26, 2014, letter sent to the Facility. A response to the January 5, 2017, letter has not been received.

Based on calculations performed by the AQD, the following has been determined:

Process Description	Rule/Permit Condition Violated	Comments
Coating Operations	R 336.1210(1) - Rule 210(1)	The PTE at the Facility of any hazardous air pollutant that has been listed under Section 112(b) of the Clean Air Act appears to be over 10 tons per year.

Please provide a facility-wide PTE demonstration for all pollutants at the source. Information on calculating PTE can be found at the following website:

If the Facility's PTE is over the major source thresholds specified in R 336.1211(1), then the Facility must obtain legally enforceable emission limits below the major source thresholds by submitting an application for a Permit to Install to the AQD Permit Section, Lansing; or must submit a Renewable Operating Permit application to the AQD, Kalamazoo District Office. Please submit either of the applications within 60 days of the date of this letter.


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Please initiate actions necessary to correct the cited violation and submit a written response to this Violation Notice by March 3, 2017. The written response should include: the dates the violation occurred; an explanation of the causes and duration of the violation; whether the violation is ongoing; a summary of the actions that have been taken and are proposed to be taken to correct the violation and the dates by which these actions will take place; and what steps are being taken to prevent a reoccurrence.

If the Facility believes the above observations or statements are inaccurate or do not constitute violations of the applicable legal requirements cited, please provide appropriate factual information to explain your position.
