## VIOLATION NOTICE

On September 11, 2017, the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Air Quality Division (AQD), conducted an inspection of Weber Sand & Gravel, Inc. located across from 37974 Townline Road, Birch Run, Michigan. The purpose of this inspection was to determine Weber Sand & Gravel, Inc.'s compliance with the requirements of the federal Clean Air Act; Part 55, Air Pollution Control, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended (Act 451); the Air Pollution Control Rules; and to investigate a recent complaint which we received on September 9, 2017, regarding fugitive dust attributed to concrete crushing operations.

During the inspection, staff observed the following:

During this inspection, it was noted that Weber Sand & Gravel, Inc. had commenced operation of unpermitted equipment at this facility. The AQD staff advised Weber Sand & Gravel, Inc. on September 11, 2017, that this is a violation of Act 451, Rule 201.

A program for compliance may include a completed PTI application for the mineral crushing process equipment. An application form is available by request, or at the following website: <a href="www.michigan.gov/deqair">www.michigan.gov/deqair</a> (in the shaded box on the upper right hand side of the page).

Be advised that Rule 201 requires that a permit be obtained prior to installation, construction, operation, reconstruction, relocation, or alteration of any process or process equipment which may be a source of an air contaminant.

Please initiate actions necessary to correct the cited violation and submit a written response to this Violation Notice by October 2, 2017 (which coincides with 21 calendar days from the date of this letter). The written response should include: the dates the

dates the violation occurred; an explanation of the causes and duration of the violation; whether the violation is ongoing; a summary of the actions that have been taken and are proposed to be taken to correct the violation and the dates by which these actions will take place; and what steps are being taken to prevent a reoccurrence.

If Weber Sand & Gravel, Inc. believes the above observations or statements are inaccurate or do not constitute violations of the applicable legal requirements cited, please provide appropriate factual information to explain your position.
