VIOLATION NOTICE

On September 18, 2014, the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Air Quality Division (AQD), conducted an inspection of your facility located at 2125 Riggs Avenue, Warren, Michigan. The purpose of this inspection was to determine your facility's compliance with the requirements of the federal Clean Air Act; Part 55, Air Pollution Control, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended (Act 451); the administrative rules and to investigate a recent complaint which we received on September 15, 2014, regarding fugitive dust fallout attributed to your facility's operations.

During the inspection, staff observed the following:

During the inspection, it was noted that Magnacheck had installed and/or commenced operation of unpermitted process/control equipment (5 shotblast equipment with single fabric filter emission control system) at this facility. The AQD staff advised Mr. Bucholtz on September 23, 2014, that the fabric filter collector exhaust was inappropriately designed and the filter system was not preceded by a mechanical precleaner. These findings did not meet AQD Administrative Rule R 336.1285(I)(vi)(C) exemption from

permit to install requirements. Thus, the process/control equipment is a violation of Act 451, Administrative Rule R 336.1201 (Rule 201).

A program for compliance may include a completed PTI application for the 5 shotblast equipment with single fabric filter emission control system. An application form is available by request, or at the following website:

Be advised that Rule 201 requires that a permit be obtained prior to installation, construction, operation, reconstruction, relocation, or alteration of any process equipment which may be a source of an air contaminant.

Please initiate actions necessary to correct the cited violations and submit a written response to this Violation Notice by October 16 (which coincides with 21 calendar days from the date of this letter). The written response should include: the dates the violations occurred; an explanation of the causes and duration of the violations; whether the violations are ongoing; a summary of the actions that have been taken and are proposed to be taken to correct the violations and the dates by which these actions will take place; and what steps are being taken to prevent a reoccurrence.

If Magnacheck believes the above observations or statements are inaccurate or do not constitute violations of the applicable legal requirements cited, please provide appropriate factual information to explain your position.

Thank you for your attention to resolving the violations cited above and for the cooperation that was extended to me during my inspection of the facility.
