VIOLATION NOTICE

On January 8, 2018, the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ), Air Quality Division (AQD), performed an asbestos NESHAP (National Emission Standard for Hazardous Air Pollutants) inspection at 1502 East Michigan Avenue, Kalamazoo, Kalamazoo County. The purpose of this inspection was to determine compliance with the requirements of Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 61, Subpart M (National Emission Standard for Asbestos), and Rule 942 of Part 55, Air Pollution Control of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended.

According to my investigation, the Kalamazoo County Land Bank owns the subject facility and Tolson Total Environmental was hired to perform the planned renovation or abatement work. The planned renovation or abatement work took place on or about January 5, 2018. The National Emission Standard for Asbestos holds both the owner and operator equally liable for any violations.

During the inspection, staff observed the following:

The contractor had failed to remove all regulated asbestos containing material (RACM) from the facility. RACM in the form of thermal systems insulation (TSI) was observed on three duct registers, which included: two registers in bedrooms on the second floor and one register in the dining room.



Please initiate actions necessary to correct the cited violation and submit a written response to this violation notice by February 7, 2018, (which coincides with 21 calendar days from the date of this letter). The written response should include: the dates the violation occurred; an explanation of the causes and duration of the violation; whether the violation is ongoing; a summary of the actions that have been taken and are proposed to be taken to correct the violation, and the dates by which these actions will take place; and what steps are being taken to prevent a reoccurrence. The signed written response to this violation notice may be submitted by mail and directed to my attention at; DEQ AQD, P.O. If you believe the above observations or statements are inaccurate or do not constitute a violation of the applicable legal requirements cited, please provide appropriate factual information to explain your position.
