## **VIOLATION NOTICE**

On May 8, 2019, the Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE), Air Quality Division, performed an asbestos NESHAP (National Emission Standard for Hazardous Air Pollutants) inspection at 154 Lake Street, Pontiac, Oakland County. The purpose of this inspection was to determine compliance with the requirements of Title 40 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 61, Subpart M (National Emission Standard for Asbestos), and Rule 942 of Part 55, Air Pollution Control of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended (Act 451).

According to my investigation, the Donato Group, Inc., owns the subject former school and Affordable Abatement and Inspections, LLC, performed the abatement activities. The National Emission Standard for Asbestos holds both the owner and operator equally liable for any violations.

During the inspection, staff observed the following:

Abatement had taken place at the former school. However, the contractor failed to remove all Regulated Asbestos Containing Material (RACM) and some of the material, which had been removed, was not adequately wetted to ensure that it remained wetted until collected and properly contained.

Please initiate actions necessary to correct the cited violations and submit a written response to this violation notice by June 3, 2019, (which coincides with 21 calendar days from the date of this letter). The written response should include: the dates the violations occurred; an explanation of the causes and duration of the violations; whether the violations are ongoing; a summary of the actions that have been taken and are proposed to be taken to correct the violations, and the dates by which these actions will take place; and what steps are being taken to prevent a reoccurrence.
