**VIOLATION NOTICE**

On June 24, 2015, the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Air Quality Division (AQD), conducted an inspection of Penske Vehicle Services located at 1225 E. Maple Road, Troy, Michigan. The purpose of this inspection was to determine Penske Vehicle Services' compliance with the requirements of the federal Clean Air Act; Part 55, Air Pollution Control, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended (Act 451); the administrative rules and the conditions of Permit to Install (PTI) number 279-05.

During the inspection, staff observed the following:

Process Description	Rule/Permit Condition Violated	Comments
Surface coating	PTI No. 279-05, Special Conditions 1.9, 2.9, 2.10, 3.9, 3.10, 4.6, 5.6, 6.6, 7.4d, and 7.4e.	Permittee failed to record material use per each emission unit and flexible group, and calculate emissions per each emission unit and flexible group.

During this inspection, Penske Vehicle Services was unable to produce the permit required emission records for each emission unit and flexible group. This is a violation of the recordkeeping specified in Special Conditions number 1.9, 2.9, 2.10, 3.9, 3.10, 4.6, 5.6, 6.6, 7.4d, and 7.4e of PTI number 279-05.


The conditions of PTI number 279-05 require the permittee to complete all required calculations in a format acceptable to the AQD District Supervisor and make them available by the 15th day of the calendar month, for the previous calendar month, unless otherwise specified in any recordkeeping, reporting or notification special condition.

Please initiate actions necessary to correct the cited violations and submit a written response to this Violation Notice by July 31, 2015. The written response should include: the dates the violations occurred; an explanation of the causes and duration of the violations; whether the violations are ongoing; a summary of the actions that have been taken and are proposed to be taken to correct the violations and the dates by which these actions will take place; and what steps are being taken to prevent a reoccurrence.

If Penske Vehicle Services believes the above observations or statements are inaccurate or do not constitute violations of the applicable legal requirements cited, please provide appropriate factual information to explain your position.

Thank you for your attention to resolving the violations cited above and for the cooperation that was extended to me during my inspection of June 24, 2015.
