**VIOLATION NOTICE**

On January 7, 2016, the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Air Quality Division (AQD), conducted an inspection of Grandville Printing located at 4719 Ivanrest Avenue SW, Grandville, Michigan. The purpose of this inspection was to determine Grandville Printing's compliance with the requirements of the federal Clean Air Act; Part 55, Air Pollution Control, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended (Act 451); and the administrative rules.

During the inspection, staff observed the following:

| Web Presses         | Rule 336.1201                  | Failure to obtain Permit to Install            |

After the inspection, AQD staff requested an updated potential to emit demonstration be completed and submitted to the AQD in order to determine Grandville Printing's compliance with Rule 210, which was received from February 9-19, 2016. The records provided demonstrate that with the addition of the web press installed in February 2014, potential emissions of Volatile Organic Compounds from the printing process equipment are 105 tons per year, which exceeds the Major Source threshold of 100 tons per year. This is a violation of Rule 210.

Additionally, the current recordkeeping is insufficient to demonstrate compliance with Rule 290. This is a violation of Rule 201.



Please initiate actions necessary to correct the cited violations and submit a written response to this Violation Notice by March 15, 2016 (which coincides with 21 calendar days from the date of this letter). The written response should include: the dates the violations occurred; an explanation of the causes and duration of the violations; whether the violations are ongoing; a summary of the actions that have been taken and are proposed to be taken to correct the violations and the dates by which these actions will take place; and what steps are being taken to prevent a reoccurrence.

If Grandville Printing believes the above observations or statements are inaccurate or do not constitute violations of the applicable legal requirements cited, please provide appropriate factual information to explain your position.

Thank you for your attention to resolving the violations cited above and for the cooperation that was extended to me during my inspection of Grandville Printing.
