VIOLATION NOTICE

On September 29, 2014, the Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ), Air Quality Division (AQD), reviewed the semiannual Renewable Operating Permit Deviation Report, submitted on August 29, 2014 for Magna Mirrors (Magna) located at 700 South Park Drive, Newaygo, Michigan. The purpose of this review was to determine Magna's compliance with the requirements of the federal Clean Air Act; Part 55, Air Pollution Control, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended (Act 451); the administrative rules; and the conditions of Renewable Operating Permit (ROP) number MI-ROP-N5056-2011.

During the review, staff observed the following:

Wet Coat Paint Line	MI-ROP-N5056-2011, EUWETCOAT, Special Condition I.12	Exceeded dibasic ester 12-month rolling emission limit for the months of June - August, 2014

The records provided demonstrate that actual emissions of dibasic ester from the EUWETCOAT process equipment were over the permitted limit. The conditions of ROP number MI-ROP-N5056-2011 limit the emissions of dibasic ester to 1891 lbs/year based on a 12-month rolling time period as determined at the end of each calendar month.

Please initiate actions necessary to correct the cited violation and submit a written response to this Violation Notice by October 23, 2014 (which coincides with 21 calendar days from the date of this letter). The written response should include: the dates the violation occurred; an explanation of the causes and duration of the violation; whether the violation is ongoing; a summary of the actions that have been taken and are proposed to be taken to correct the violation and the dates by which these actions will take place; and what steps are being taken to prevent a reoccurrence.
